The Australian Air Force Cadets (AAFC) are taking delivery of four additional Diamond DA40 aircraft, taking the total fleet operated by the AAFC Elementary Flying Training School (EFTS) to 12 aircraft.

Powered Service Provider program using civilian air charter and flying schools is also being established to support cadets in the Wings where the EFTS does not operate. Meanwhile, the AAFC Gliding Training School continues to operate a fleet of 11 DG1000S gliders in QLD, NSW and SA. Our aim is to provide every cadet with an aviation experience in powered aircraft and in more senior years, to provide some cadets with the opportunity to learn how to fly in powered aircraft or gliders. 

We have set a goal to be the best youth development program in Australia.






uniform of the RAAF and the issue of the RAAF General Purpose Uniform (GPU) continues that fine tradition.
