The flying training and aerospace opportunities offered by the AAFC provide the perfect opportunity for young Cadets aged in their mid-teens to see their career take off.

As an instructor or staff member you can play a vital role in our flying training program to give Cadets exposure to, and inspire their interest in, the aerospace industry through education in theoretical and practical skills of aircraft handling, aircraft engineering and flight operations

You will help develop future leaders within your community, to become capable, confident and resilient young adults.

While imparting your knowledge to help these young adults grow, you will improve your own skills too.

Flying Training opportunities

Aviation Operations Wing (AOW) delivers flying pathways to Air Force Cadets through gliding and powered flying experiences and training. Cadets as young as 15 years – the minimum legal age – may have the opportunity to fly their first solo flight in a VH-registered powered aircraft or glider.

Elementary Flying Training School

EFTS delivers flying pathways through powered flying experiences and training, conducted through its three hubs – Amberley Flight (Queensland), Richmond Flight (NSW) and Point Cook Flight (Victoria) – using Diamond DA40 NG Star aircraft.

Gliding Training School

GTS delivers flying pathways through glider flying experiences and training, conducted through its three hubs – Balaklava Glider Training Flight (SA), Bathurst Glider Training Flight (NSW) and Warwick Glider Training Flight (Queensland) – using DG1000S gliders.

Getting involved

Flying Instructors, Cadet Aviation Experience Pilots (powered) and Air Experience Instructors (gliding) are needed to allow the AAFC to continue teaching the aerospace industry's next generation.

There are also opportunities for qualified staff to support operations in the fields of aviation governance, aviation safety, WHS, operations planning, personnel management, administration and finance.
