The competition is held over five days and tests teams on all aspects of field craft including camouflage, concealment, navigation, knots, lashings, survival and observation skills.

ADULT LEARNING CONTINUUM REVIEW

The skill and experience of our adult members is critical to the success in delivering the AAFC cadet learning continuum.

The Adult Learning Continuum Review (ALCR), will analyse, design and develop the learning requirements for AAFC adult volunteer staff. The ALCR will be based on a revised construct of the AAFC which has mapped the roles and development pathways for all adult volunteer staff.

The ALCR will focus on three distinct learning areas; organisational understanding, role specific knowledge and skills and leadership. Similar to the Cadet Learning Continuum Review (CLCR), the intent is to provide adults with a contemporary learning experience that is engaging, relevant and provides a worthwhile development opportunity.

Design and development is due to commence in Jan 23 and will be conducted by an external service provider. The aim is for new material to be trialled in late 2023 with piloting of new learning initiatives in 2024.
